Fratelli Tutti – 224 "Kindness frees us from the cruelty that at times infects humans relationships, from the anxiety that prevents us from thinking of others, from the frantic flurry of activity that forgets that others also have a right to be happy. Often nowadays we find neither the time nor the energy to stop and be kind to others, to say excuse me, pardon me, thank you. Yet every now and then, miraculously a kind person appears and is willing to set everything else aside in order to show interest, to

give the gift of a smile, to speak a word of encouragement, to listen amid general indifference..."

WEEK 5



We are one family, bonded together and sent to change conditions that breed poverty, injustice, discrimination and marginalization.

Fratelli Tutti – 230 "Working to overcome our divisions without losing our identity as individuals presumes that a basic sense of belonging is present in everyone. Indeed, society benefits when each person and social group feels truly at home. In a family, parents, grandparents and children all feel at home; no one is excluded. If someone has a problem, even a serious one, even if he brought t upon himself, the rest of the

family comes to his assistance; they support him. His problems are theirs.....In families, everyone contributes to the common purpose; everyone works for the common good, not denying each person's individuality but encouraging and supporting it.The joys and sorrows of each of the family members is felt by all. ...IF only we could view our political opponents or neighbors in the same way that we view our children or our spouse or mother or father!"
